

LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – February 9, 2022

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held February 9, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. Present were Michael Porter, James Glover, Michael Whitman, Ginger Bollinger, Dale Tshudy, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco and Catherine Wise.

Michael Porter motioned to approve the January 26, 2022 Regular Meeting minutes. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Report for February 10, 2022– General Fund: \$19,984.73 and State Fund: \$6,782.27. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$501.45. ARPA Funds: \$6054.17. Line of Credit Account: \$1004.53. capital Reserve Fund: \$1500.00. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

Resident and Newly Appointed member of the Erie County MPO Board – Dale Tshudy was present to inform the Supervisors that he has been in contact with the newly elected County Executive – Brent Davis. They have discussed the need for funding of improvements to rural roads. Dale has also been in contact with Emily Alois and he has forwarded e-mails to the LeBoeuf Township Supervisors of their conversations. Mr. Tshudy stated that additional funding for roads may be available in the future and Erie County does have a Grant Writer who may be able to help write grants for the township. The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors and Mr. Tshudy discuss contacting Erie County Council Representative Samuel “Charlie” Bayle, to discuss funding for roads and to have him represent the needs of LeBoeuf Township and other rural townships in Erie County.

Michael Porter motioned to sign Resolution #1 of 2022 – County Aid to be used for Seal Coat – Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes. Michael Porter would like to know why County Aid has been reduced. Road Foreman Report: Plowing and Cindering. Gravel Crushing bids will be opened at the next meeting. Solicitor Nietupski will be asked to write up an agreement to send to Wilkinson Gravel for re-crushing of 2021 gravel.

Zoning Officer Tim Pie reported that the Variance and Special Exception for the Business at 850 Route 6N and the Dog Grooming Business on Kinter Hill Road were both granted by the Zoning Hearing Board on February 3, 2022.

Discussion was held on revising the Logging Permit application. It will now have the following statements included on the permit: Frost Laws must be observed March through May and One (1) Landing Site per Permit.

Correspondence was read & reviewed.

Michael Porter motioned to sign Bills & Payroll for February 10, 2022. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Whitman moved, seconded by Michael Porter, to adjourn the regular meeting at 9:00 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.
