

## **LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – March 23, 2022**

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held March 23, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. Present were Michael Porter, Michael Whitman, James Glover, Ryan Wilkinson, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco and Catherine Wise.

Michael Whitman motioned to approve the March 9, 2022 Regular Meeting minutes. James Glover seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Report for March 24, 2022– General Fund: \$48,820.59 and State Fund: \$170,602.45. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$6355.68. ARPA Funds: \$6,054.40. Line of Credit Account: \$51,004.53 Remaining. Capital Reserve Fund: \$1500.00. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

Ryan Wilkinson submitted an alternate agreement. Discussion was held on last year's crushing and this year's crushing needs. Due to the cost to the Township to have Wilkinson re-crush last year's gravel due to the size, Supervisors are discussing the option of having them crush a select amount of gravel this year at a smaller size to meet budgeted amounts for gravel crushing costs. Ryan Wilkinson will present a quote at a future meeting. Tabled. Ryan Wilkinson left at 6:18 p.m.

Supervisors reviewed Quotes for 2022 Brine. Michael Porter motioned to hire Randy Brace/Dodson Trucking to provide brine to LeBoeuf Township at a cost of \$0.26, per gallon. (70,000.00 gallons - \$18,000.00) Michael Whitman seconded the motion. All voted yes. A quote was also received from Seneca Mineral for \$0.42, per gallon, a quote of \$95.00 per hour was received from Pennfield, Supervisors decline using Pennfield brine due to it not lasting on roadways.

In regard to Ordinance #1 of 2022 – Weight Limit Ordinance: The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors will hold a public hearing on April 27, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. Solicitor Gery Nietupski and Engineer Mark Corey will be requested to attend the hearing to answer any questions posed at the Public Hearing.

Supervisors agreed to pay for 2 Firemen to attend the ECATO Fireman's Dinner. Supervisors requested that Solicitor Gery Nietupski be asked his advice on townships borrowing money for road improvements. The Supervisors reviewed the PSATS America250PA Resolution. They opted not to pass the Resolution presented.

Road Foreman Drew Francisco reported that Rindfuss Drilling will need to drill a new water well due to the current pipe not being able to be fixed. The 672 Grader needs a new turntable gear box. Supervisors agreed to pay up to \$5,000.00 for the repair and parts. Supervisors agreed to the rental of an excavator from Bobcat of Erie for the cost of \$1,230.00 per week.

Secretary Report: The Spring Newsletter was reviewed again. Security cameras were discussed. Supervisor Michael Porter suggested looking into Google Nest. Prices will be acquired.

Zoning Officer Tim Pie reported that an additional letter is being sent to the Rainbow Farm to continue with the clean-up of the property. A letter will be sent to Michael Gleba who owns property of McGahen Hill Road. The house, which caught fire over a year ago, has not been demolished and is becoming an attraction for teenagers. He will be asked to clean up the property and demolish the house. Supervisors agreed to rent 2 dumpsters from Pro Waste for clean-up day. One dumpster may be used for tires. Clean-up Day signs will be ordered and picked up in April. Cost is \$185.00 for 10 signs, to be reused yearly.

Correspondence and Permits were read & reviewed.

James Glover motioned to sign Bills & Payroll for March 24, 2022. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Porter moved, seconded by Michael Whitman, to adjourn the regular meeting at 7:25 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
