

## **LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – March 9, 2022**

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held March 9, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. Present were Michael Porter, Michael Whitman, James Glover, Ginger Bollinger, Charlie Bayle, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco and Catherine Wise.

Michael Whitman motioned to approve the February 23, 2022 Regular Meeting minutes. Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Report for March 10, 2022– General Fund: \$123,991.83 and State Fund: \$174,823.49. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$501.45. ARPA Funds: \$6,054.40 Line of Credit Account: \$1,004.53 Remaining. Capital Reserve Fund: \$1500.00. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

County Councilman Charlie Bayle, who was invited by the LeBoeuf Township Supervisors to attend the meeting, introduced himself and explained why he ran for County Council. He stated that he is here for the community and will be always available for questions. Discussions were held on Broadband, County ARP funds, Investment in Infrastructure, Casino money from ECRA, etc. Charlie Bayle left at 9:05 a.m.

Michael Porter motioned to sign the 2022 Conservation Grant for Conneauttee Road. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

Supervisors chose not to attend the ECATO Fireman's Dinner and do not have any Bid Quantities to submit to the EACOG Joint Bidding Bid.

The Gravel Agreement letter was sent to Wilkinson Excavating, Supervisors are awaiting reply.

Mark Corey sent the Weight Limit on Roadways Study and Ordinance. Supervisors will send the Ordinance to Solicitor Nietupski for review.

The Two Gravel Crushing and Screening Bids, which were opened at the February 23, 2022 meeting, were discussed. Supervisors will request the minimum amount that the bidding companies would be willing to crush. Tabled.

Road Foreman Drew Francisco reported that the Road Crew has been trimming trees on various roads. Tim Pietrasewicz has been hired to help. The 672 grader is out for repairs. Millings are still being purchased and trucked in., the cost has increased \$1.00 per ton this year. Quotes will be acquired in regard to excavation of roads this year. The water well at the building needs to be perforated. The cost is approximately \$1,200 - \$1,400.

Secretary Report: The Spring Newsletter was reviewed.

Zoning Officer Tim Pie reported that the letter has been received by the property owner of the Rainbow Farm – Julie Collins. The property needs cleaned up by the end of March.

Correspondence was read & reviewed.

James Glover motioned to sign Bills & Payroll for March 10, 2022. Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Porter moved, seconded by James Glover, to adjourn the regular meeting at 10:10 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.
