

## LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – July 27, 2022

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held July 27, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. Present were Michael Porter, James Glover, Michael Whitman, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco, and Catherine Wise. Guests: Ron Ethridge, E.J. Brown, Denny Triscuit, Ginger Bollinger, Dan Williams, Jeremy Markham, Troy Reynolds and Ed Falconer.

James Glover motioned to approve the July 13, 2022 Regular Meeting minutes. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Report for July 28, 2022– General Fund: \$41,936.90 and State Fund: \$59,582.78. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$5,866.55. ARPA Funds: \$6,055.42. Capital Reserve Fund: \$5,000.09. Line of Credit: \$1,000.00 remaining. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

### Public Comment:

Dan Williams and Jeremy Markham asked when Union LeBoeuf Road will be fixed. The road is deteriorating, and the potholes need patched. Supervisors informed them that core samples were taken and there is a good base, but the road needs more drainage. At present time, LeBoeuf Township only has one full time employee and 1 part time employee. LeBoeuf Township is trading equipment, trucking, etc with Washington Township and hiring out some of the road work. Residents were informed that there are 46 miles of roadway that needs to be maintained and the township is working on hiring another employee as soon as possible. Ron Etheridge asked if the Supervisors plan on placing millings down on Union LeBoeuf before placing more tar and chip. Supervisors are considering it.

Union Township Supervisors E.J. Brown and Denny Triscuit were present to discuss the replacement of the bridge on Union LeBoeuf Road at an estimated cost of \$2.3 million. Emily Aloiz from Erie County Planning and Community Development informed LeBoeuf Township that Federal Funds are available, along with Erie County Act 13 funds, to replace the bridge at minimal costs to the 2 Townships. Supervisors from LeBoeuf Township and Union Township agreed to proceed with the process, which could take up to 6 years to complete.

At present time, the Union LeBoeuf Road Bridge needs debris cleaned out from under it, there are numerous trees piling up. Dan Williams, owner of L&D Tree Trimming, stated that he and his crew will cut up the trees, which are blocking the flow of water and putting pressure on the bridge structure, at a cost of \$600.00. Supervisors from LeBoeuf Township and Union Township agreed to split the cost. There is also a washout on the Bridge. LeBoeuf Township road crew will fix the problem and invoice Union Township for half the cost of concrete to fix it. Denny Triscuit, E.J. Brown and Ed Falconer left at 6:50 p.m.

Mr. Ethridge still has a problem with the ditch on Stone Quarry Road. He was told that it is in the Township right of way and it is needed for drainage.

One Roller bid was received from Caldonia Diesel for a cost of \$28,900.00. Michael Porter motioned to accept the bid; Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes. A check was signed and will be mailed.

Supervisors agreed to vote on the Weight Limit Ordinance at the next meeting. A public notice, announcing the passing of the ordinance, will be published in the Newspaper, since it has been over 60 days since they first reviewed it.

Supervisors received and reviewed the current Budget and Expenses Reports.

The Pension Audit has been started and will be complete within the next 2 weeks.

A Small Flow Sewage Treatment Facilities report was received from Erie County Department of Health. The ECATO Annual Picnic will be held on Thursday August 24, 2022. Solicitor Gery Nietupski is still working on the Mill Village Volunteer Fire Company Insurance Billing Ordinance. He will be asked to send an Employee Application form to use for new applicants.

Road Foreman Drew Francisco stated that millings have been crushed and are ready to be used. Discussion was held on fixing Dutchtown Road – Washington Township has agreed to place a skim-coat of asphalt on the problem spots of the road. The Road Foreman and Supervisors agree that tiling and ditching needs done on Dutchtown Road. Gravel in the Mystic Pit is being screened and crushed. All budgeted brine has been used. Tar & chip will be placed on roads in August, but there will not be any new sections added, due to lack of employees, etc.

Correspondence was read & reviewed.

Michael Porter motioned to Sign Bills & Payroll for July 28, 2022. James Glover seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Porter moved, seconded by Michael Whitman, to adjourn the regular meeting at 8:05 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
