

LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meetings – May 14, 2025

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisor's Regular Meeting was held on May 14, 2025. The meeting was called to order at 8:03 a.m. Present were William Phillips, James Glover, Michael Porter, Tim Pietrasewicz, David & Rebecca Hampton, Betty Miller and Catherine Wise.

Michael Porter motioned to approve Regular Meeting Minutes from April 23, 2025. William Phillips seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Report for May 15, 2025, General Fund: \$230,443.02, State Fund: \$88,916.85. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$7,174.45, Capital Reserve Fund: \$35,000.54. William Phillips seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. & Mrs Hampton and Betty Miller were present to speak with the Supervisors concerning a property on Old Route 19 South that needs cleaned up. Supervisors authorized Solicitor Gery Nietupski to send a letter. The Hamptons and Ms. Miller left at 8:15 a.m.

Supervisors voted to give the Zoning Officer \$100.00 in petty cash to use for change and a Receipt Book for anyone who asks for a receipt.

Ed Musgrave quoted \$1.25 a foot to lay tile on Woods Road. Additional phone quotes may be acquired.

A letter was received from Terry Scutella – a county council member stating that the check received from County Executive Brenton Davis was not approved and may need to be returned in the future.

Michael Porter motioned to sign the Intergovernmental Agreement with Mill Village Borough for the costs of Tar & Chip on Woods Road. William Phillips seconded. All voted yes.

The Roller was placed on Municibid – so far it is up to \$7,100.00. The Mower Tractor is now working and will be placed on Municibid. Purchasing a newer mower from Franklin Township is being considered

Discussion was held on finding information and grants for a camera system at the Route 6/6N/19 Traffic Light, instead of loops set in the roadway. A Corry Redevelopment Grant may be available.

William Phillips motioned to sign Ordinance #2 of 2025 – The Slaughter house amendment to the Zoning Ordinance. Michael Porter seconded the motion. All voted yes.

The request by the Mill Village Volunteer Fire company was tabled again. Supervisors would like a more information on number of calls and income from said calls.

Robin Yapple submitted 2 Right to Know requests. She appealed to the Office of Open Records in Harrisburg. Nietupski/Angelone is handling the responses with Right to Know Officer Catherine Wise providing requested information.

There are Amish signs on Route 6 which is blocking the sight distance. A letter will be sent to the landowner concerning the sign.

The Board of Planners sent a short letter concerning additional changes to the Zoning Ordinance. The Board of Supervisors agreed that all Accessory Buildings should be permitted. Solicitor Gery Nietupski advised not getting rid of the Special Events Permits. Changes were Tabled.

Resident Greg Troyer arrived at 9:10 a.m. to speak with the Township Supervisors concerning Solar Farming and Leases on their property. Supervisors gave him a copy of the Solar Ordinance to review.

Road Forman Report: Ditching, Grading and Spraying. Beavers are on Stone Quarry Road again. Andy Francisco will be called to trap them out. The Screener has been moved to the Gravel Pit. Salt Brine is \$0.35 a gallon. One tank of Brine covers approximately 1 mile of road surface.

Zoning Officer: 1 permit was submitted. Everything is ready for Clean-Up Day. Subs will be ordered this year. An event will be held at Bison Beer. Supervisors advised that a Special Event Permit should be granted due to the fact that it is still in the Zoning Ordinance at the time.

Correspondence was read & reviewed.

William Phillips motioned to Ratify Bills & Payroll for May 1, 2025, Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes

Michael Porter motioned to Sign Bills & Payroll for May 15, 2025, William Phillips seconded. All voted yes

James Glover moved, seconded by Michael Porter, to adjourn the regular meeting at 10:10 a.m. Motion carried unanimously
